Term Time Absence

Cornwall Council have asked schools to make it clear to parents the potential consequences of taking your child out of school without permission. As a school, we have a duty to report unauthorised absences to Cornwall Council. If you wish to take your child out of school, please complete the absence form (available on request) at least one month before the planned leave.

"If you decide to take your child out of school, without permission, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who as the issuing officer will may decide to take legal action against you. A penalty notice can be issued under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Fines are issued per parent/carer, per child. Failure to pay the penalty notice may result in Court action. Persistent absences not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2,500 and/or custodial sentences."

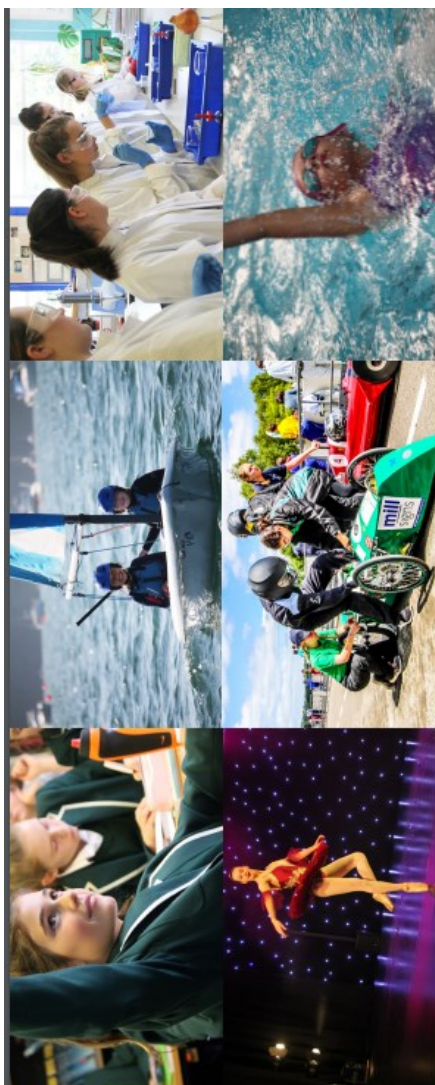

EASY WAYS TO GET INVOLVED

The Giving Machine

An online UK Charity helping UK based schools benefit from free cash donations! Retailers pay the school, every time one of our supporters (that's you) shops online through their website. It's easy to join, and it's easy to shop. Please help us by registering with The Giving Machine, selecting Cusgarne Primary School, and using the site each time you shop to find your favourite retailers. You'll find all the big ones, Next, Amazon, eBay, for example, and you'll earn free money for school (it doesn't cost you a penny, other than what you are already buying).

The Crisp Packet Recycling Scheme

In conjunction with Terracycle, we collect empty crisp packets (not popcorn) for cash. Every kilo in weight, earns the school £2. This may not seem like much, but since starting the scheme in January, we have earnt almost £55 for school funds.....that's a lot of crisp packets collected, and a lot saved from landfill. A recycling bin can be found in reception. We welcome your empty packets from home, and from friends and family too, because the more we collect, the more we raise.

HOW TO KEEP UP TO DATE WITH FRIENDS NEWS AND EVENTS

We like to hold various events through the school year too, and we use as many ways as possible to let you know in advance of upcoming events, and how you could help us. They are:

- Facebook – please like and follow us, we are “Friends of Cusgarne School”

- Noticeboard – we do what we can to keep the FOC noticeboard up to date (beside the shed in the playground)
