Summer Term

Now that the sunshine has arrived, the children are making good use of the fields and play equipment.

Please remember that the children need a pair of trainers with them every day—and maybe check your child's trainers over the holiday. Some children are complaining that their toes are rubbing.

The children know the safety rules when using the outside equipment, and we have staff on duty keeping a careful eye on the children when they are using the equipment. I remind you that if you allow your child to use the equipment after school, the safety rules still apply and that the equipment is used at your own risk. You MUST remain responsible for your children and keep them well supervised. In addition, please do not allow them to climb on the gazebo; and remember that ball games are not allowed after school unless they are part of a staff led activity.

The sun-safe campaigns have started and I know this is a topic parents are keen to support. Children need a sun hat they can keep at school but please note that unfortunately, we cannot allow children to wear sun glasses unless they have been prescribed and are properly fitted by an optician. The coloured lenses do cause problems with children not clearly seeing steps and trip hazards during playtimes.

We ask that parents apply sun cream to their children before they come to school. Should your child bring sun cream to school, please make sure that it is clearly labelled and that they know how and when to apply the cream. As you know, staff are under no obligation to apply sun cream to the children so if your child needs help; please speak to the class teacher.

The summer school uniform can now be worn. Girls may wear red and white checked summer dresses. Our uniform policy allows shorts to be worn to school as long as they are smart tailored shorts.

If you have any questions about our uniform, please ask in reception.
