Dear Parents

Thank you for coming along to our open afternoon on Tuesday. It was lovely to see you sharing time with your children in class and to give them the opportunity to show you their work. Before the end of term you will be receiving a school report for your child which will give you a more in depth summary of their school year.

The class photo proofs from Tempest were sent home via bookbag post so please have a look. If you wish to place an order, make sure you complete the order form and hand into Reception by next Tuesday morning.

Sadly, I have a few messages to pass on this week. It has been noted that some parents are dropping off their child at the school gate and are not escorting them into the playground. Please bring your child into the playground and make sure there is a member of staff on duty before leaving them. If a child is late, please use the top gate and bring them into Reception. I do not want a repeat of an incident where a parent who was running late, dropped a child at the lower gate. By the time they arrived, the gate was already locked and the child had to walk up the road by themselves. This puts your child in DANGER so please do not be tempted to leave them.

I have also had to speak to a number of children this week about abusing school property. Once children are dismissed at the end of the school day, they are your responsibility. Do not let your children climb the school boundaries and please stop them straight away if you see them drawing on the school buildings. We have had several children drawing with conkers on the school walls. It is not funny and does not come off. We have limited budgets and the school is not due to be re-painted this summer.

I really do not like having to come down heavy handed but if this behaviour continues, I will have to consider locking the school grounds once the children have been collected.

Please help me and the staff to keep Cusgarne a happy community where we can all share the lovely environment we have.
