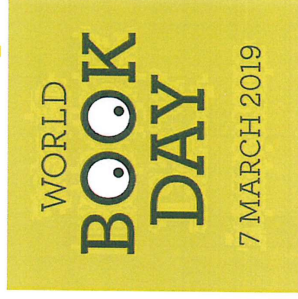
COLOUR RUN – 01ST APRIL

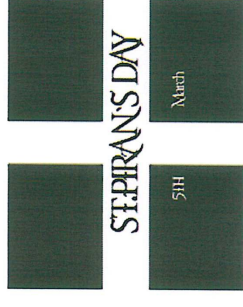
