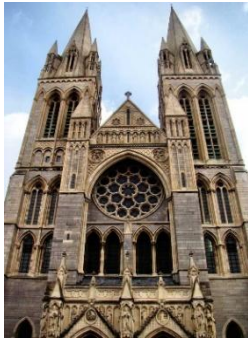


What is it like to live in Cornwall?

Where is my locality?

Truro is in the South-West of the UK in the county of Cornwall. It is the capital city of Cornwall.



How is land used in my locality?

There are different types of land use, including:

Residential – Places where people live.

Commercial – Places that sell goods or services.

Industrial – Places that build, make or store goods.

Recreational – Places where people go to enjoy themselves, exercise or relax.

Transport – A system of conveying people or goods from place to place, including buildings that facilitate this.

Learning and Public – Places where people go to receive an education or are occupied by a public authority.

What are the geographical features of my locality?

There are two types of geographical features:

Human Geographical Features –

Human or man-made features of a landscape. This can include buildings, roads, bridges and harbours.

Physical Geographical Features –

Features of the landscape that would exist even if there were no people. This can include rivers, mountains, valleys and beaches.

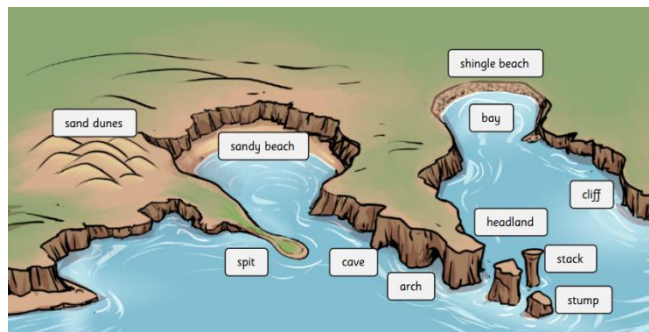
Can I draw a sketch map of my locality?

Sketch maps are simple maps people use to show places, give directions and provide a tourist guides/information.



What are coasts?

The coast is the place where the land meets the sea or an ocean.



How are coasts changing?

Coasts are constantly changing due to the processes of erosion and deposition.

Erosion –

Parts of the coastline get worn down and moved by natural forces such as water and wind.

Deposition –

Landforms can be created by sediment left behind by the waves.
