


What were the greatest achievements of Ancient Egypt?



<p>What is the chronology of Ancient Egypt?</p> <p>People have lived in Egypt since the beginning of the Stone Age in Britain. By 5000 BCE, they migrated near the River Nile, where they began living in large villages. These settlements grew to create an ancient civilisation which lasted thousands of years.</p>	<p>What was life like in early Egypt?</p> <p>There was a hierarchy in Ancient Egypt and people with certain jobs were more important than others.</p> <p>The pyramid illustrates the social hierarchy of ancient Egypt, with the pharaoh at the top and farmers and slaves at the bottom. Other levels include government officials, nobles, priests; soldiers; scribes; merchants; craftsmen; and farmers and slaves.</p>	<p>Did the Egyptians write anything down?</p> <p>The Ancient Egyptians used symbols that represented sounds or words called Hieroglyphics to write things down.</p> <p>A grid of 26 hieroglyphic symbols, each labeled with a letter from A to Z. The symbols represent various objects and sounds.</p>
<p>Who were the Egyptian gods?</p> <p>The Ancient Egyptians were polytheistic which meant that they worshipped more than one God. Each God ruled an aspect of life.</p>	<p>What did the Ancient Egyptians believe about the afterlife?</p> <p>The Egyptians believed in life after death and because of this, they prepared bodies for the afterlife through the process of mummification.</p>	<p>How were the pyramids built?</p> <p>The Egyptians built pyramids to transport pharaohs to the afterlife. There are different theories about how the pyramids were built.</p>
