Next term, our theme will be 'Under the Sea' and we hope that we are able to visit the beach alongside our learning.

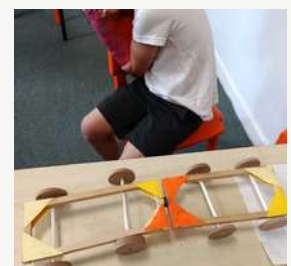


# Class updates

This week, Kingfisher Class have been in London, exploring the sights and having an amazing time. You can see more updates from our fantastic trip on Facebook.

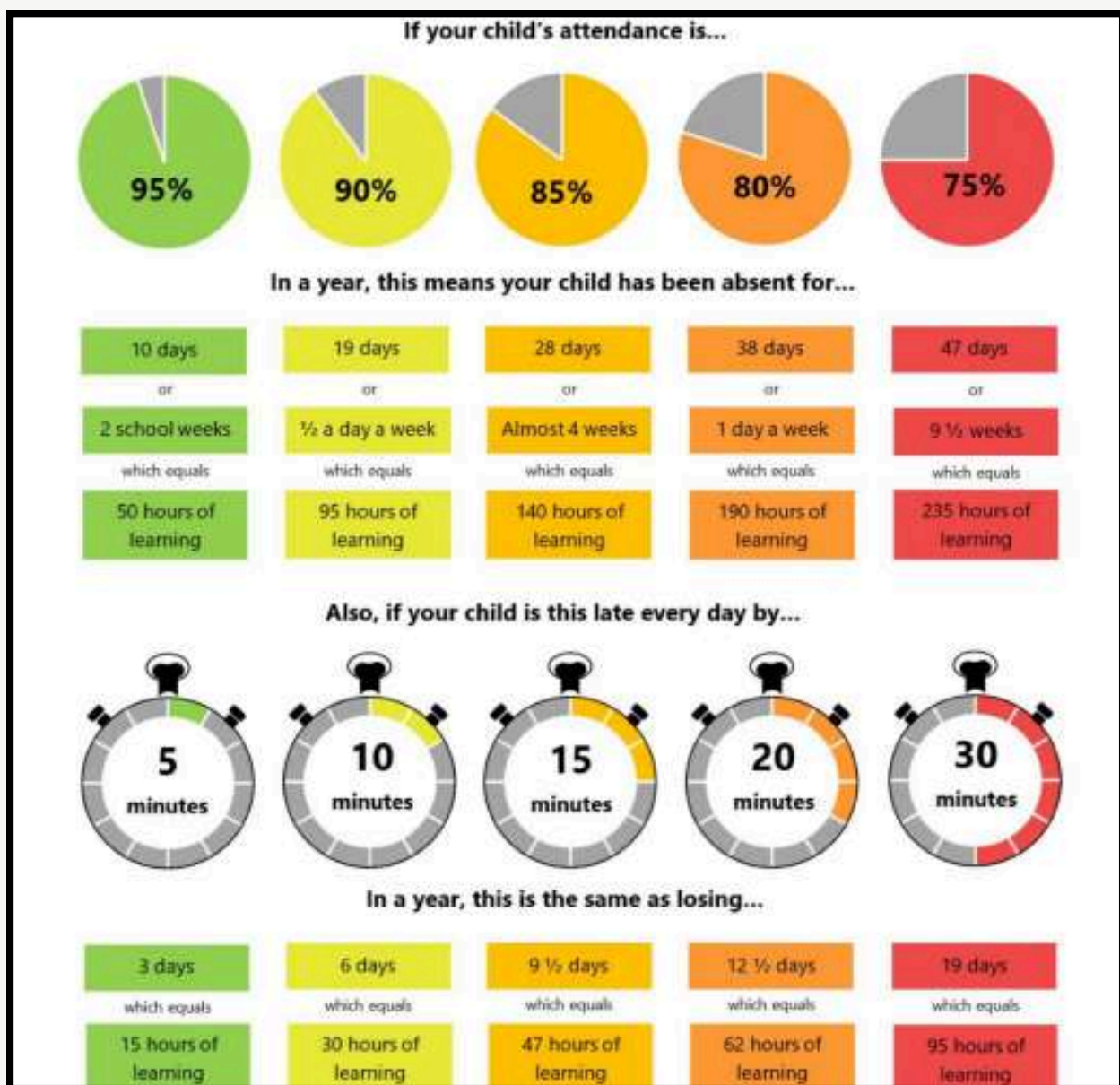


Next term, we will begin our geography unit on sustainability. We are looking forward to visiting the Cusgarne Organic Farm weekly to support our learning.
