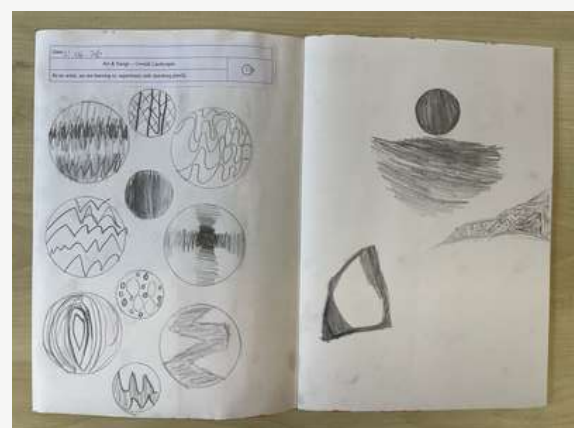
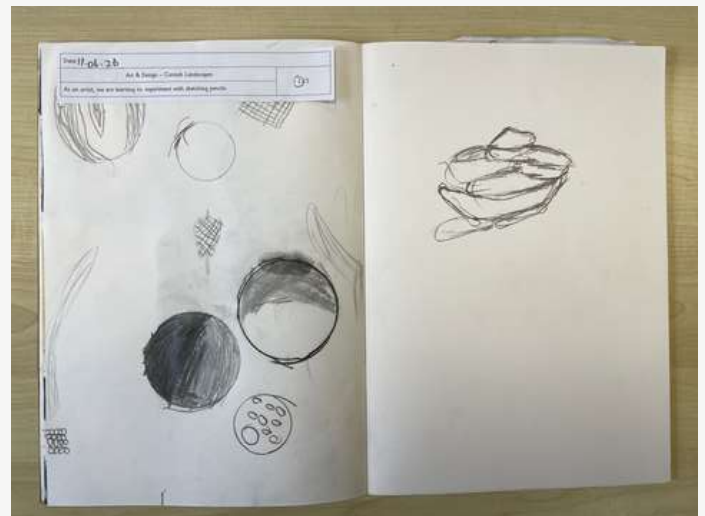


Class updates

It's been a fantastic week in Kingfisher Class! Our Year 5 pupils loved taking part in the Aspire Games and represented the school brilliantly.

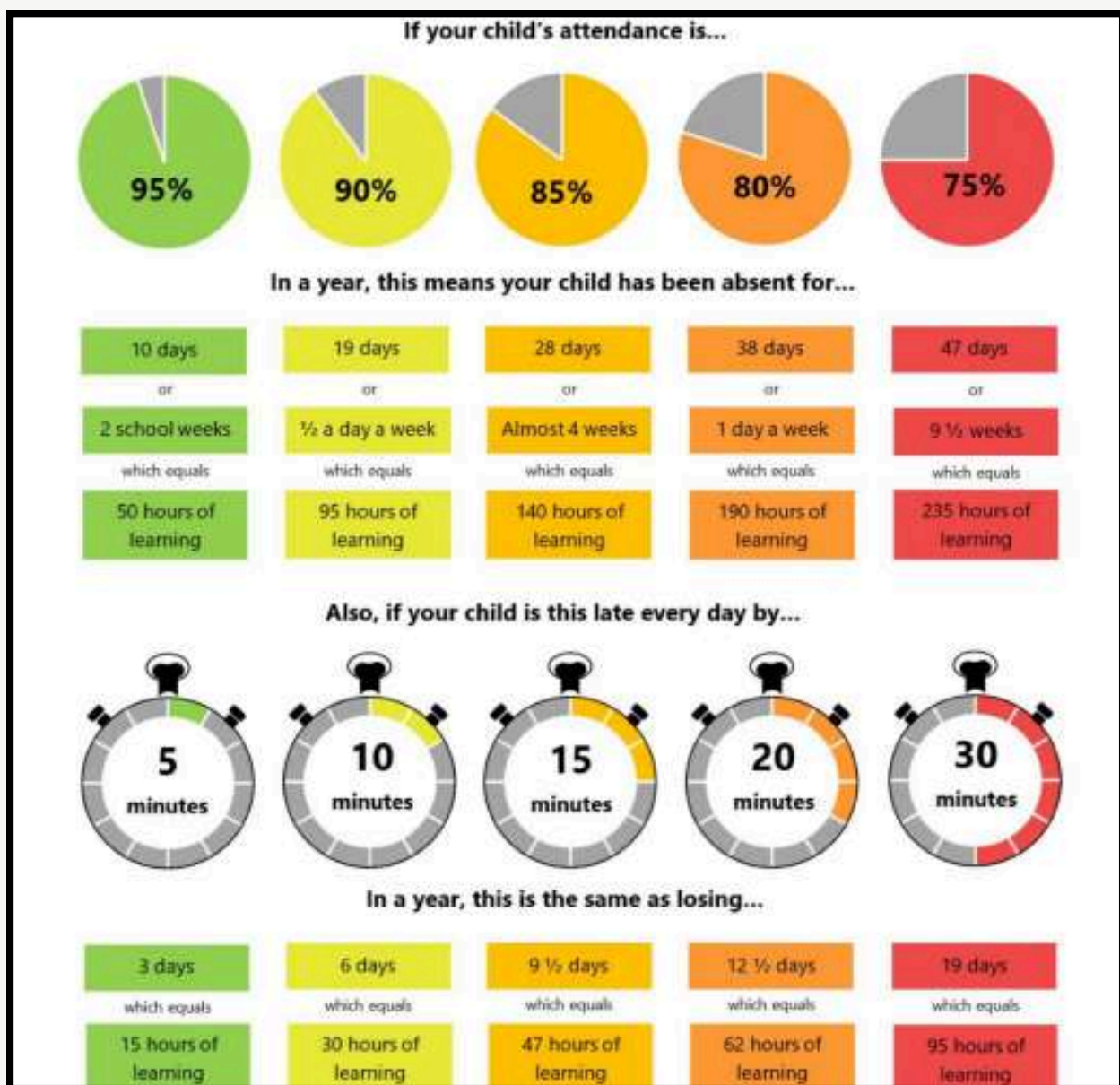


Next week, we're excited to begin our farm visits, linking our sustainability learning to the world around us.
