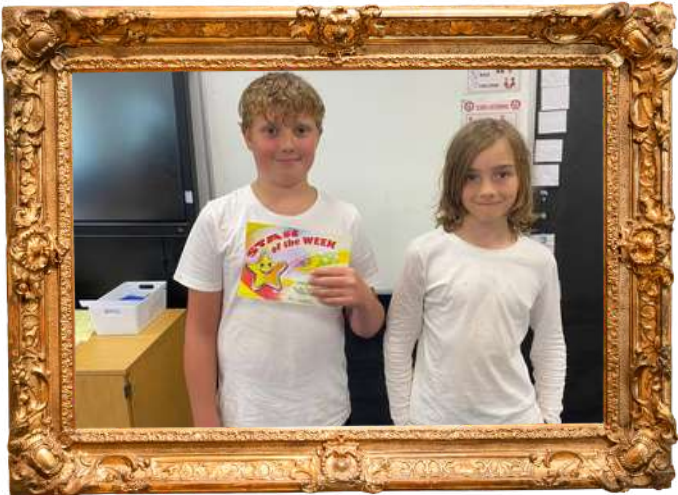

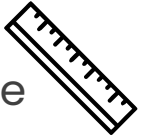

Next week, Starling Class are looking forward to finishing writing their adventure narratives in English.

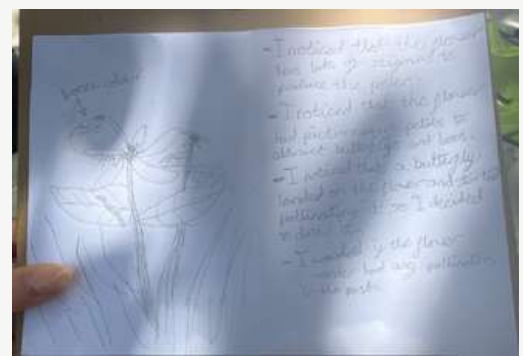


# Class updates



## Kingfisher class

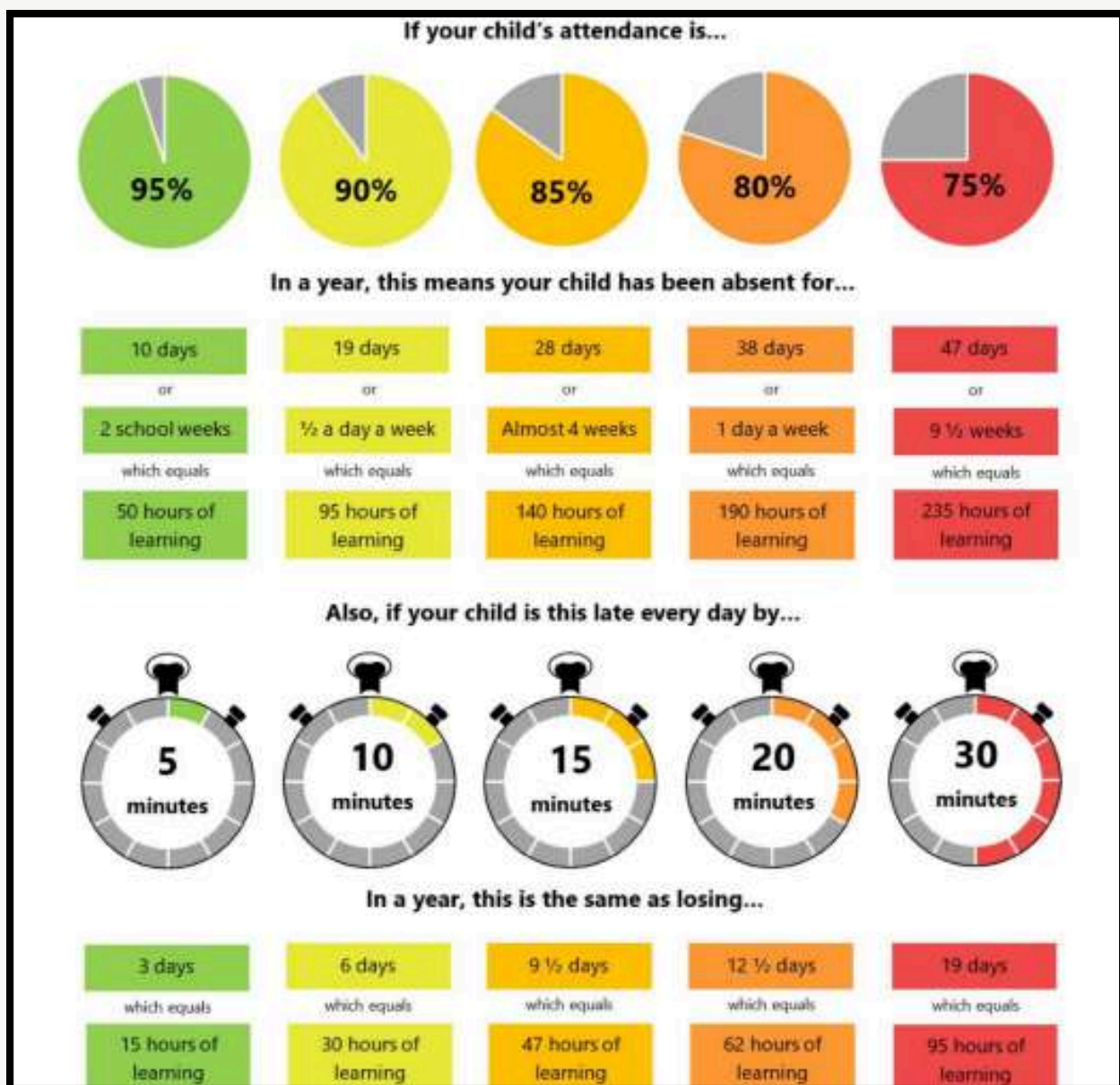
