#### **Dear Parents**

The children have been working hard and enjoying their learning, a highlight for me over the last week was seeing all the classes expressing themselves in the Friday afternoon dance sessions, in collaboration with the Hall for Cornwall. The dance leader said that she loved the engagement of the children and their freedom to express themselves through movement – each class will be working towards creating a movement piece based on their class topics.

The reception children were outside this week, enriching their learning and using the experiences of our Forest school Leader Mrs Denton, to broaden their learning outdoors. Yesterday they were using the fallen leaves to make outdoor art, making the biggest leaf pile in the world apparently, and reports were given to me firsthand on how much they loved the learning experience, and they also told me about all the other wildlife they encountered. We are in the process of enriching this area further and will keep you aware of these developments.





In Starling Class, I spoke with two children on Wednesday for a length of time as they showed me the fruits of their hard work. They have been letter writing to influential people about the climate change challenge, and these two children had a reply from HRH Prince William. He is leading a global initiative to celebrate innovation and creativity, tackling this issue that is upon humanity, to make



positive and progressive steps forward. I was incredibly proud of the two children for their efforts, and their next challenge will be to develop ideas of how they can make a difference in their own community.

Yesterday, children and adults in the school observed a one minutes silence to honour and remember the people who gave their lives to support the belief of what they felt was right, as they went in to battle. Also, it is important to recognise that it is 100 years of the Royal British Legion, and to celebrate the wonderful work this charity continues to do.


