<u>School dinners</u> Caterlink, or school caterers have confirmed that they will be continuing the current menu when we return after Easter. <u>Breakfast Club</u> Following a review of our charges and the cost of providing Breakfast Club, we will be increasing the daily charge to £2 per pupil per day starting from 19 April 2021. Please remember to continue to book your child into Breakfast Club either by email or a phone call.

<u>September starters</u> For any families who have a child due to start school in September, please note that National Offers Day is Friday 16 April 2021. Since this falls in the Easter holidays, we will find out who our new children are on our return to school and will then make contact with the families.
