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

Dear Parents

I hope that you all have a super half term and are ready for the run up to Christmas. The new national lockdown comes into force today and will once again affect all our daily lives. The government has released their guidance for schools which in brief, is that we shall continue with our in-school measures to minimise the risk of infection and carry on with all the normal functions of a school day. The children are being absolute stars and are regularly washing their hands throughout the day and adhering to all the other hygiene rules we have in place.

Obviously we are all very aware of the need to keep safe distances and regularly wash our hands. We would like to remind parents that this applies to you too. Please be respectful of the 2m rule when waiting/dropping off your children and use the 'waiting areas' (in green circles on the map below). Please do not congregate in the gate areas – especially near the top gated area where it is narrow - as this reduces the amount of room people have to safely pass by.





We want everyone to feel safe and are mindful that some parents may be in the clinically vulnerable category and are understandably more nervous about passing close by other adults not stood in the waiting areas.

We notice many more adults are wearing face masks when dropping off and collecting and welcome this. However, until the government guidelines on masks being worn in primary schools changes, which includes the playground, we are unable to enforce mask wearing.

Please be reassured that we are doing all we can in school to maintain as much normality as possible and I hope it helps to know that the children are all really happy and enjoying being around their friends.

Over the weekend, please take a moment to check that your child/ren are able to access the home learning section of the school website. If you are having any difficulties, please let us know so that we can rectify this as soon as possible.


If you are having a Bonfire Party, please stay safe and remember to follow the instructions of the adults. Have a super weekend.
