The children have returned to Science Week and have been exploring and experimenting!



Kingfisher class started Science week by carrying out an experiment called lemon volcano.

Throughout the week, they have also been finding out about space which will help with the letters they are writing for a competition run by UKSED, in which the children have to apply for a job in the space industry.

Robin and Puffin class have been learning about the life cycle of a frog and we have our very own pond. We have observing what has been happening each day and seeing how the frog spawn is changing into tadpoles. 
