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Dear Parents,

A very happy new year to all our families at Cusgarne School, and I hope that you all enjoyed your Christmas festivities! We are delighted to be back with the children at school. Another reminder to all children to give their parents a nag to listen to them read where possible every evening 0. Reading is such an important part of our curriculum and reading daily to an adult can have a dramatic impact on a child's reading development and comprehension. It also allows them to develop



their skills in other curriculum areas. It is good for children to read to a variety of adults, not just in school, which is why we encourage you to listen to your child read every day.

After school clubs will recommence next week, with no alterations to days/times. We hope to sustain this throughout the course of the term, providing we have sufficient staff cover etc.

As we enter the coldest time of the year, please ensure that children have sufficient layers since we are still ventilating classrooms with open windows, and we don't want them getting cold. Children must also have a coat in school for break and lunch playtime.

Please make sure you read the Covid update letter that is being sent out to all parents this week. As always it would be very helpful if you could let a member of staff know if you have any positive cases within your household, so that we can be vigilant for any signs of symptoms within our school setting.

Please be aware that unfortunately Chickenpox is currently circulating the school, so please keep an eye on your child for any signs of this.
