

English

- Fiction-a focus on describing characters and settings in stories, writing their own modern Greek Myth/ Quest.
- Non-chronological reports- Linked to topic work.
- Poetry- dialogue poems.
- Oracy (including drama)- speaking clearly in a concise manner, considering the listener.
- Grammar and punctuation- A focus on grammar, punctuation and spelling when writing using the Percy Jackson series as a stimulus. Some discrete lessons on higher level punctuation, they will then transfer their learning into their writing.
- Comprehension- answering questions that involve retrieving answers or drawing inferences from the text and making predictions.
- Spelling Zoo- common exemption word for years 5/6.

Science – Animals including Humans, Inheritance and Variation

- Plan different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions, report and present findings, including explanations, conclusions and graphs,
- Demonstrate prior knowledge of systems within the human body.
- Describe how drugs and alcohol can impact negatively on the body.
- Recognise the beneficial impact of a healthy diet and exercise on the human body.
- Explain the terms adaptation, evolution and natural selection and use these in context. • Describe how living things evolve via the process of natural selection.
- Explain in simple terms what genes and DNA are.
- Investigate the ethical issues of human intervention in the process of evolution by natural selection.

Music- Classical Era

- learn out about music and composers from the Classical era 1750- 1827.
- Use Musiclab to compose music

French- The Body, What do I look like?

- learn to describe their own appearance, and talk about their emotions and health, increasing their conversational skills.

PSHE

- Mental health and keeping well- feelings, managing challenge and change, exploring risk, social media.
- Puberty- changes both physically and mentally during puberty, understanding their and other's bodies and how they relate to reproduction.

RE

- Christianity- what kind of king is Jesus? What faith do the people in Cornwall turn to when life gets hard.

Maths- fluency, reasoning and problem solving

- Fractions- equivalence, simplifying, compare, order, + x - ÷ fractions.
- Decimals and percentages.
- Statistics- drawing and interpreting different graphs.
- Solving reasoning questions and multi-step problems, involving mixed operations.
- Fluency - daily 10 minute calculation practice involving all four operations.

- Say when the Ancient Greek people lived and order some events from the time on a timeline.
- Describe some key facts about the Battle of Marathon and the Trojan War and answer questions to demonstrate their understanding.
- Examine artefacts in order to draw conclusions about what life was like in Ancient Greece.

Geography- Our Changing World

- describe how physical, chemical and biological weathering change rocks.
- explain how some coastal features are formed and identify the location of some famous coastal features in Cornwall.
- identify how the borders of the UK and Europe have changed over time.
- identify ways the Cornish landscape has changed over time.

PE

- Striking and fielding games- cricket.
- Net games- tennis.
- Athletics- throwing, jumping and running.
- Swimming/ surf day- if allowed.
